MUSICAL ACHIEVEMENTS

Queen Elizabeth's offers a multitude of performance platforms for both soloists and ensembles. There are five large-scale concerts in each academic year featuring all of the large ensembles and chamber groups. There are also smaller-scale performance opportunities throughout the year at which boys from all years may perform solos and chamber music. In addition to the main concerts, our ensembles are regularly invited to perform as guests at events outside school by amongst others the Chair of Hendon St Mary's and the past and present Mayors of Barnet. The largest scale event in the musical calendar is the House Instrumental Competition where every boy who learns a musical instrument is expected to perform a solo piece to earn points for his House. In addition, there is a concert tour in alternate years in the UK or abroad. Recent destinations have included Holland, Paris and The Rhineland. The school is an examination centre for the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music.

The three Choirs provide the music for two great occasions in the school calendar, the Carol Service and the Founder's Day Service. In recent years our boys have performed with professional musicians in the West End and appeared as both chorus and soloists at Covent Garden, Glyndebourne, the Royal Albert Hall and English National Opera.

Some of our boys augment their musical education through attendance at the junior departments of the Royal Academy of Music, the Royal College of Music and the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London. In recent years, a number of our pupils have successfully auditioned into national ensembles including the National Youth Choir of Great Britain, the English Schools Orchestra, the National Children's Wind Orchestra and the South Asian National Youth Orchestra.

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Music Scholarships are awarded in Year 7 for excellence in performing. Up to six scholarships are awarded at the Music Scholarship Evening, which takes place in February. The event is preceded by aural and sight reading tests, while on the evening itself, a panel of adjudicators assesses the performances.

The winning pupils are awarded £150 as a contribution towards instrumental tuition for the following summer term at the School.
